In the Bible there is a story about rich young man who was called by Jesus to follow him, but because of his attachments to his riches the Gospel concludes that the man "Went away sad."

But why does he go away from Jesus with sadness rather than with joy? It is because his treasure and his hope for happiness are misplaced. Treasure has a special connection to the heart, the place of desire and longing, the place of will and focus. In this world many of us think that treasure or riches will make us happy. And of course we cannot deny it helps. Yet very often it becomes a source of anxiety and even of strife. If we judge our lives by what we cannot afford – we don't have a big house, we don't have a nice car, we can't afford holidays in the sun – our lives will always be about what we don't have.

Our possessions do not and cannot truly satisfy the deep yearnings of the human heart; only love can do that. The young rich man had family to support and a business to look after, but he went away sad because the deepest part of his spiritual self went empty.

When you have children you want them to learn that life is about more than wanting the new iPhone or fashion accessory. You want them

- To learn that what is most valuable is not what they have in their lives, but who they have in their lives. Our friends and family those that love us.
- To learn that there are people who love them dearly, but simply do not know how to express or show their feelings. But if you look around they will be there looking out for you, supporting you, showing it in everything they do.
- To learn that money can buy everything but happiness and that lack of money does not mean you have to be unhappy.
- To learn that a true friend is someone who knows everything about them . . . and loves them anyway.
- To learn that it is not always enough that they may be forgiven by others, but that they have to forgive themselves.
- To learn that all in life is not explainable and sometimes you just have to take that leap of faith. Remembering that God has a plan for you and we grow through the dark times even more than the light times, if we allow God to be our teacher.

Sarah-Jane was a Brownie Guide at St. Peter's Church, Aldborough Hatch, and attended the William Torbitt Primary School, Seven Kings High School and Redbridge Music School. In 2010 Sarah-Jane was Essex Young Musician of the Year. This British soprano opera singer graduated from the Royal College of Music in 2009 and received her diploma from the Royal Academy of Music in 2013, finishing her education at the National Opera Studio in 2014. She has won multiple awards including the Hampshire National Singing Competition in 2013.

In 2014, she won second place at the Kathleen Ferrier Awards.
